# John and Tom's February 12-Car RegRun

The fourth round of this year's series of Sunday morning 12-Cars took us to the lanes of North West Kent, starting from the 7 Hotel & Diner on the A224 just north of Sevenoaks. Plotting for both Regularity A and B had been issued ahead of the event, but there was some work to do on the day as not all of the grid references supplied for Reg A were to be used – the ones to use were only issued after signing-on.

This was only the second time Simon and I had entered an event together and, having won the first time out we both feared that there was only one way to go after that! We set off quite early and, on the way, passed a lay-by at Crown Point that was going to feature later on Reg B - "Bet there's a control there," we both commented - we were not wrong! After completing the gruelling 4.6 mile calibration route we headed for the Diner where the green Rover of stalwart marshals Harry and Linda was already parked up.

We signed on – joined the dots for Reg A, worked out the speed changes – then had a natter with the other entrants while we waited for the 'off'. The Sunday morning 12-Cars are proving very popular and it was good to see another full entry and a great range of cars from Eric and Cheryl's 1950s A40, to Kevin and Gavin's more modern Peugeot 307.

Reg A started at the Diner and we headed west, past Knockholt, before heading south under the M25 and then crossing the A25 near Sundridge. The route continued south through Ide Hill, where we luckily didn't encounter the hoards of cyclists that Tom had mentioned at signing-on – but we

did manage to find the sneakily positioned second timing control - phew! The route took us through Sevenoaks Weald, before passing under the A21 near Hildenborough then across the Common Shipbourne before coffee at Hadlow. We thought we had had a good run, finding all the controls with what we thought were good times – chatting with Eric and Cheryl at Coffee we were surprised to hear they had uncharacteristically missed the second control (it was on a 'Long Way Round' near Ide Hill).

Reg B was compressed onto a very small piece of the map, John and Tom having done a great job of using nearly every bit of road between Hadlow and the finish at The Padwell Arms near Stone Street. The roads were great, with a couple of hairpins thrown in for good measure to keep the drivers on their toes (and add a grin, of course). We were pleased to find all the controls including



Colin and Caroline in a lay-by I had used when organising a previous run, Keith and TomW in the Crown Point lay-by we had spotted on the way to the start and, of course Harry and Linda, at the very last control at Bitchet Green, where I had manned a control on previous events. It does go to show how organising events, or helping to marshal can give you an edge when competing (here's the sales pitch we are <u>always</u> looking for volunteers to organise or marshal on events!).

2nd O/A for Peter & Craig's '72 Stag - a good day! Time for a pint and a bite to eat at the pub while

we waited for the results. Apart from being held up just before the control at Crown Point, we thought we had had a good day and everyone seemed to have enjoyed the route plus, of course, the weather had been very kind to us. Unfortunately, the gremlins got into the results system and, although poor old Tom slaved over a hot lap top the computer chips won the first round and issuing the results had to be postponed (this weekend AndyG was up at the HRCR Dinner & Dance, officiating in his *other* job as HRCR Clubman's Rally Championship Coordinator).

When Tom published the results later in the day - it's amazing what a bit of peace and quiet and a nice cup of tea (or was it gin?) can do! - we were very pleased to see that we had won, ahead of Peter and Craig in the Stag and Neil and Valerie in the Mini (a proper one). Looking through the results, many crews had some very impressive times but, for some it was a case of 'if only'. Had Neil and Valarie not taken a short cut and if Mike and Colin in the TR6 had not missed the very last control etc the results table would have looked very different.



over five days but not like any British rally that you have ever been on before.




Over the last decade things have moved on in Europe. The ACM are the organizers of the Monte Carlo Grand Prix, the WRC World Rally Monte Carlo and the Historique. These are their only three events, no weekly 12 cars, pub nights and quizzes. Each of the three events is organized in the same uber-professional manner.

Even our humble historic cars are fitted with GPS tracking units and our every move is watched by satellites. There are no marshals on regularities and the normal is 10 timing points on each. At the end you pull forward alongside an ACM car and your record file is automatically downloaded to their computers.

Inside the cars every competitor is running with a sat nav and digital average speed devices - most have the route already downloaded onto the system via a file that they have bought before the event. All of this with the complete knowledge of the organizers. Of course we turned up without all of this and that is

where our chances ended! More importantly, I watched a standard of ice driving that I have never seen before. Renault Alpines, Porsche 911's and Opel Kadetts absolutely flying up the mountain cols in the hands of incredible drivers. The Europeans have all moved to newer machinery and our venerable MGB was simply outclassed on the ice (as was its driver). Even though I flew up those stages faster than I have ever driven on ice before I was more than a minute down on the times on particularly nasty roads. Sigh.... must try harder and practise more.

This year was a classic. Very cold weather, fresh snow and the most fantastic roads to drive. Valence and Burzet loops and the Monte Carlo night loop including La Bollene-Versubie, Sospel and the Turini all in the same rally! This is a memory that you can take to your grave with you. Yes, we survived it all, un-penalized on the road, every control visited on time and only penalty





points a teach timing control moving us inexorably South into 217th position out of 317 entries. 50 cars crashed out in a desperate attempt to make the times and so we beat only 50 other contestants. Yet we were proud of our efforts, a maximum commitment that we kept up day after day....And at the end?

A prize giving ball in black ties or ball gowns and over a thousand people in Monte Carlo's grandest ball room. Foie Gras and Champagne flowed and the silverware would fill the Casino's vaults. It is a world of glamour, high speed antics and support crews tending highly strung machinery. It is not rallying as we know it, but it is better for it and definitely an event not to be missed if you can squirrel away the entry fee.

Will we be back?

Not half!...

Yesterday I went to watch the Daytona 500. It had warmed up to 26°C and was a lovely clear sunny day; unlike the last couple of occasions where it rained! There were a few minor crashes, most involving the wall.

As you probably know the track is a banked oval and the cars are going flat out at up to 200mph. The photo shows one of the bends in the last 15 laps. As you can see after the first few cars, the others are three across and at 200mph!! One of the other spectacles was when the cars came into

the pit lane. Here the max. speed is 55mph and the smoking 'tires' were quite something and one tyre exploded due to the heat.

You might be able to add this to Highway - but it is not exactly a Regularity Run!!

### Some interesting 'Points' from the Sunday Times Driving Magazine:

<u>Slow motion</u> - I keep hearing talk of an 80mph speed limit, but if anything the limit should be lowered to 60mph. There would be fewer accidents, a reduction in fuel consumption and a more relaxed driving experience. Some states in America seem to manage OK with a 55mph limit. (*Any comments? - Ed*).

<u>Fast Talk</u> - The late John Davies said, "There are two types of dangerous drivers: those over 70 who travel under 20, and those under 20 who travel over 70."

<u>Yellow Peril</u> - If the new Hadecs3 speed cameras are painted yellow....law-breakers will create even more hazards by breaking sharply whenever a device is spotted.

<u>Brush with the law</u> - I note that Ed the Red plans to paint speed cameras. As the reason seems to be to stop us being caught unawares, is he planning to paint unmarked police vehicles the same shade of yellow?


