"The Kent 100 Rally"

Having had to withdraw from the Vale of Clwyd Classic, when the clutch on the MGB disintegrated the day before Rich Harrison went on holiday in Germany for 3 weeks, it looked as if there would be a long gap between the East Anglian Classic in June and the Throckmorton Challenge in October. However, a phone call from Trevor Hawkins asking if I could navigate on the Kent 100 in his nice Triumph TR4 was an offer not to refuse.

So on Saturday 29th August a planned 20 classics turned up at the Road House Café on the A20 at Lenham for the pre-event formalities and breakfast. The measured distance was quickly done and we signed on to receive the first set of route instructions. The whole route was on OS Sheet 189 (just, as Headcorn Aerodrome is right on the west edge!), though in fact the map was not really necessary. However, the first handout for Regularity A was a set of Tulips with distances and times to be read 'as seen on the road', but there was plenty of



time to plot it onto the map. I like to do this, if there is time, as I like to know where I am and it can



be useful if we wrong slot! We were off at Number 1 and had a trouble free run 'til we encountered a horse box which was completing unloading. It lost us only a few seconds but Ian Crammond and Andy Gibson in Car 0 were not so lucky, and we caught them up as they were hammering in a code board, having been seriously delayed. We arrived at Headcorn where there was the usual aerial activity, for a coffee and to receive the next handout.

Regularity B was a marked map with the route to follow clearly defined and, as with Reg A, there were five Timing Points as well as code boards to record. It took us past High Halden and Bethersden and a big loop onto Shirley Moor before arriving at the lunch halt at the Rare Breeds





Centre near Woodchurch. Again we had a decent run with Trevor driving well to the average speeds and calling the code boards. This section had sets of speed tables for each stretch between timing points, an unusual system, for me at any rate, but one which I liked. Lunch in the Granary Restaurant was fairly leisurely and there was time to deal with the next handout for Regularity C. This was in the form of two sections of the OS map marked with twenty six lettered points and we had to route via nine of them, without passing through any of the rest. The correct route took us through Kenardington, Snargate, Brookland, Benzett and St Mary in the Marsh to the tea halt at Lathe Barn, Burmarsh. Care was needed to plot the route and to navigate the sections especially round Brookland and on the Marsh, but again we had a good run.

We now received details of Regularities D and E. The first was a tulip section and on this one we had a bit of trouble near Shadoxhurst when we came up behind several Gypsy groups on their trotting outfits. They seemed to be racing on the road and not happy to be overtaken. Being first car, we eventually got by, though not without some indecipherable abuse from the drivers. The sixteen cars behind us were even less well received and a big queue built up. The final Regularity was a slightly unusual Jogularity in which basically only junctions were given, interspersed with distances of 0.20 miles for which times were given. This meant that really there was no excuse for not being on time all the time, though of course it didn't work out like that! The final control at The Woolpack at Tutt Hill saw everyone back safely and the normal exchange of tales of hold ups, if onlys etc., while the results were calculated. Trevor and I were more than pleased to come out as winners, with Mark and Neil Worsfold in the MGB 2nd and Charles Harrison and Phil Smith 3rd in the Triumph 2000. Incidentally Trevor and I were in the oldest car and I reckon the combined ages to us and the car come to something just short of 200 (Trevor doesn't *look* 93! - Ed).

It had been a really well thought out and well run event with absolutely immaculate route instructions, spot on distances and perfectly produced route instructions. The venues were great; the route well chosen, code boards clearly visible, and well marshalled.

Congratulations are due to Andy as C of C and to all the marshals. It was good to see such a variety of vehicles – 4 Triumphs, 4 MGs, 2 Minis, 1 Rover, 1Aston Martin, 1 Avenger Tiger, 1 Escort, 1 Renault, 1 Mazda and a Peugeot. It was also good to see also that, despite the fact that Philip Young is no longer with us, his rally plates and rally photos still adorn the walls of The A20 Road House. Many thanks to Trevor for asking me and for driving well and to all involved in what was a superb and enjoyable event.

Well - if you've been watching this space to see how Jane and I got on the Harry Flatters Rally, there's only a short story to tell....

It started with an 8 hour trip to Brecon, on a wet and accident prone Friday (usually about 4½ hours towing), meaning that we got there 10minutes after our supper was booked - but that's OK.

Saturday morning, we set-off in Jane's Focus to do the convoy recce of the Stages - just five in total, with three different routes, all over 12 miles long. Glorious day up on the Epynt Ranges, but the forecast for Sunday was dire.

Scrutineering on Saturday afternoon was the usual slow and long-winded affair typical of this event, which gave us a chance to chat with Tim and Susan Adams who had driven down for the weekend for a spot of spectating.

Sunday morning dawned very wet indeed. We got up to the Ranges a little late, meaning good 'service space' in the Quarry Service area was impossible to find, so we pitched up on a bit of an edge and prepared for a wet day's rallying.

So, Stage 1, 30 second starts and off we went - big crest not far in - Jane suggested I'd better ease-off a bit....she was right (*aren't co-drivers/navigators always right? - Ed*) - fried the handbrake on an uphill hairpin, finished the move with a 360° to entertain the spectators, caught another car and he only just saw me in time to move over as I drew alongside going into a 45° right, but we got to the end intact. A check on the times showed that we were the fastest 'Historic 1600', so that ought to be a good pace.

Stage 2, a repeat and we were going well until "crest, 45 left, hairpin right", to fast over crest didn't quite make the 45 left - we got on the grass, hit a rock on the hairpin hard in the right rear quarter of the car. Now, this wasn't any old rock - it measured about 4 x 2 x 2½ ft (that's about 1.23 x 0.62 x 0.77m, for young readers!) - we moved it about 6ft (1.85m), so we weren't going any further. Nobody hurt*, so wait for the remainder of the cars to go thro' and await recovery.

Two Unimogs turned-up, one with a special lift that took us away, while the other struggled a bit but eventually pushed the rock back into position. We were unloaded at a nearby junction with access to the outside world, would have been good if there was a phone signal - but 'hey', that would have been too much to ask. Whilst deciding what to, do our saviours in the form of Tim and Susan arrived to spectate and kindly took us both to the Service Area, a round trip of about 40 miles. We collected our trailer and got the car onto it, which was actually easier than it first looked and we are ready for



the earlier than expected trip home....I should say that during the whole adventure it hardly stopped raining, so we were pretty wet by now.

Many thanks to Tim and Susan for their help....

Back at my workshop, over the next couple of days inspection of the car revealed that the best repair would be another bodyshell - so that's the end of our year! We'll try to return for next year's British Historic Rally Championship.

*Also, over those couple of days an increasingly painful rib cage and a visit to the hospital revealed probable cracked ribs - recovered now though. Thankfully, Jane was uninjured and is back in Epynt Ranges on August Bank Holiday Sunday for another go....
